PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings, La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family and Friends. Wow! I cannot believe it's September already! Summer is over and life for most of us is back to its normal rhythm. Rhythm has a deep significance for human beings. Regularity is important. We all have regular meal times, regular bed times, and regular daily tasks. It's being said that rhythm is the backbone of a healthy and productive life. I believe this is true for our life in general and certainly vey true for our spiritual life.

About 10 years ago, I had a class at New Brunswick Theological Seminary, NJ, on "Spirituality of Howard Thurman". Howard Thurman (1899-1981) is the person who has most influenced African American meditative and contemplative spirituality. Thurman is brilliant and deep. He was used by God to influence many people, including Martin Luther King, Jr, during MLK's study at Boston University. In that class, the Professor underscored the importance of "spiritual rhythms" as an important tool for our spiritual formation.



I still vividly remember the Professor saying that the church is like a lazy river. The more I think about it, the more I feel our instructor was right. There are two things here. First, people can step away from the church for a while, and like the river that runs around the

water park, the church keeps moving. This can be hard at times, and even sad, watching people exit the flow of congregational life and God's movement in the world. For a variety



of reasons people may decide to exit the flow: spiritual fatigue, growing complacent or lukewarm, the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth or a desire for other things.

Second, people can re-enter after a while, and like the river that runs around the water park, the church doesn't ask them to swim back upstream to make up for lost time. There is no make-up work in the life of the local congregation, only the invitation to get back in and ride along. There is grace in that river.

So, as we embark on this New Church Year, God's invitation to His people at LCPC is renewed once more. Get back and ride along. Get back to the rhythm. The Lord has so much in store for us. Plan to join us for one of our two worship service on Sundays, plan to join our weekly PEAK gathering, be a part of a small weekly Bible Study group, serve the Lord, practice hospitality, join a Team/Committee

this year. Let's use our time, treasure, and talent to build the Kingdom of Christ.



I'm a missionary who ministers to men. Most of my work is through Influencers discipleship ministry and Souly Business men's retreats. The discipleship work is a nine-month process in small groups in person and on zoom. The intent is to be a disciple and make a disciple that replicates.

The Bible uses the word Abide in John 15, which means get close to Jesus and stay connected. The Journey discipleship process helps men and women Abide. That often leads to transformation of marriages and families.

August is the beginning of the nine-month process. I usually host two weekly groups. Two years ago, Diana and Doug Given teamed up with Lecia and me in a couples group. Last year, Steven Anderson and Evan O'Meara joined a Journey group for guys. About a dozen other LCPC men have done the same over the past decade.

You likely hear Steven, Mark Williams and I talk about the M6 monthly BBQ in Bakersfield and the three Souly Business retreats each year, in nearby Frazier Park.

Here's just one of many, many stories of

men meeting Jesus at these events. Pat T (not his real name) is six months free of a 30-year meth addiction while in prison. He asked me to help him give his life to Christ at Souly last March.

On September 7-8, we'll host the free M24 Campout with 1500 guys in Tehachapi. There's

BBQ, fishing and paintball, and a chance to experience a life-changing encounter with Jesus.

Our next LCPC Man Night is Monday Sept 30th, at the home of Mark and Cindy Williams. Last spring, we hosted it in Doug and Diana's backyard. Doug and Dan Blessinger led worship music. Jon Weingarten and Craig Carlson manned the grill for 25 well-fed guys.

On Sundays, starting this summer, I began hosting virtual Chapel for a National Youth Sports Organization. We explore with the boys and parents, topics such as faith, gratitude and making good decisions. On potluck Sundays (yummy), I host it on zoom from inside the church office's supply room before heading downstairs.

One last thought. It comes from *The Toxic War on Masculinity*, by Christian thought leader Nancy Pearcey: "Christian men who are authen-

tically committed, and attend church regularly, are actually the most loving and engaged husbands and fathers." ("Authentically committed" is defined as attending a Sunday church service or a mid-week class three times a month or more.) Wives of these men report the highest levels of happiness. They spend more time with their children – 3.5 hours more than secular men weekly. They have the lowest divorce rate – 35% lower than secular men – with the lowest rate of domestic abuse and violence of any major group in America.

Ministering to men is rewarding. I'm very grateful for the missionary support my church family provides.
